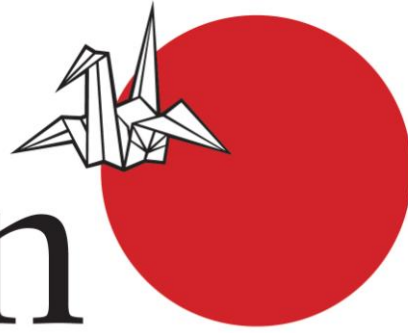


# Help Japan
